MINUTES OF ETCHILHAMPTON PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY 26 APRIL 2022 AT 7.30pm IN THE VILLAGE HALL

1 Declarations of Interests and Dispensations

Mr Woods' request for a dispensation – see 2 below – was granted.

2 Apologies for absence and approval of Mr Woods's dispensation request Mr Hanson and Mr Woods had sent their apologies.

The Council agreed Mr Woods' dispensation for absence request and it was signed by the Chair.

3 Approval of the Minutes of the last meeting

The Minutes of the previous meeting were approved and signed by the Chair.

4 Consideration of appointment of new Clerk

The Council discussed the potential vacancy for a Clerk. It was agreed to prepare a job description.

5 Matters Arising

- a Highways Mrs Clark gave an update following the meeting with WC Highways Engineer, Mr Perrott, on 15 February. He had actually sent a positive response to Mrs Clark's email of 6 April and it was agreed to wait and see what really happened. He was asked to let the Council know when the gully tanker would be visiting the village.
- b A parishioner had suggested exploring whether Etchilhampton might qualify for a 40mph speed limit. Although the Council had looked into this before to no avail it might be that the situation had changed. It was agreed to keep under review.

6 Questions/Points from the Public

- a Noticeboards. The repairs to all 4 noticeboards had now been completed by Mr Hanson. The Council thanked him for his excellent work.
- b The gale damaged Bus Shelter. The damaged bus shelter at The Mixon had also been repaired by Mr Hanson. The Council thanked him for his prompt and efficient work.

7 Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

Mr Hanson was formally appointed as the Council representative on the Jubilee Group.

a Jubilee Group. It was reported that the Jubilee mugs had now been ordered with Etchilhampton personalisation. There was a minimum order of 72 with each mug costing £3.79 (total £272.88).

As in previous occasions the village children would receive a free mug each with the rest being offered to the village at cost. The proceeds would go to St Andrew's Church and the bellcote repair.

- b Beacon The Council would co-ordinate with Stert regarding the location, timings and transport to and from for the less able.
- c Oak tree This would be supplied by Mr Will Corke as a 7yr old, 3m tall oak tree for £250 plus VAT plus £50 plus VAT for delivery, tree tie and mulch.

It was agreed that the planting would take place on 2 June during the tea ceremony on the playing field.

It was hoped that Mrs Robertson, the oldest resident of the village, would be able to cut a celebratory cake and that Mr Woods would initiate the planting ceremony in recognition of his contribution over very many years as unpaid Clerk to the Council.

8 Treasurer's Report

- a The RFO's reported on the latest invoices for payment/ratification:
 - Community First membership had been paid by Standing Order £40.
 - The invoice from SafetySigns4Less for dog fouling signs which are now in situ was ratified - £12.00
 - The VAT reclaim for 2021/22 had been received £483.44
 - The Precept for 2022/23 had been received on 25 April £3,000
 - The Bank balance stood at £6,270.46 credit.
- b Mr Nash would scan and send the completed Annual Accounts to the Council for consideration at the Annual Parish Council Meeting in May as part of the Annual Governance Statement/External Audit.
